I don't want to stay on campus for something if I know I won't be home till 10 or 11 at night. I also don't feel comfortable staying on campus for long periods of time. On campus students have a room to go back to, a place to relax on long days. I have the choice primarily between a library and the first floor of the student center, neither of which offers comfortable options of relaxing or killing time till my next commitment. If there are more comfortable options, no one has made me aware of them. I also wish a part of my freshman orientation was dedicated to commuter students. Commuting is a juggling act that is often inconvenient, yet sometimes is the only option for students to attend WSU. Giving advice on the lifestyle, time saving tricks, where to go on downtime, what commuter friendly activities to join, and tips on how to schedule for commuters would have gone a long way towards my participation in on campus activities, as well as my success at the University.
